Founded in 1917, the Lake Placid Sinfonietta has brought exceptional live music to the Adirondack region for over 100 years. What began as a small, private club orchestra has grown into a full chamber orchestra for the community, with musicians coming from leading orchestras and universities across the country. Each summer, the Sinfonietta presents a blend of free outdoor concerts, ticketed performances, and educational programs, reaching audiences from first-time listeners to lifelong music lovers. Through partnerships with local organizations, outreach in the community, and a commitment to artistic excellence, we enrich the cultural life of Lake Placid and keep the tradition of world-class music alive in the Adirondacks.

Letter from Music Director Stuart Malina

As I reflect on the past few months since we closed our 2025 season, I feel an overwhelming sense of pride in what we accomplished. It was my final season as Music Director of the Lake Placid Sinfonietta, and I can confidently say that the orchestra reached new heights of artistry, delivering stirring performances every week of the summer.

What makes this ensemble so special?

It begins with the musicians themselves. The Sinfonietta attracts exceptional artists from across the country—talented individuals who come not only for the music but also for the friendships they've formed with one another and with the community. And, of course, they come to enjoy the beauty of the Adirondacks in summer.

Our concerts are about more than just beautiful music; they are experiences that are welcoming and fun for our audiences. Music is not something to simply be “performed”—it is something to be shared, to be enjoyed together by both the orchestra and the audience. While performers are essential to a concert, we must never forget that the audience plays an equally important role in a successful performance. We are in this together.

Above all, I believe the “secret ingredient” of the Lake Placid Sinfonietta is the spirit, commitment, and joy the orchestra brings to the stage every time it performs. One of my greatest goals during my tenure was to cultivate a culture of hard work, balanced with mutual respect and enjoyment. A happy orchestra plays better than an unhappy one. My hope for my successor, the lucky individual who will follow me, is that they continue to foster and build upon this culture.

The future of the Lake Placid Sinfonietta is incredibly bright. Next season brings new venues, as we prepare for the beautiful new hall being built at the LPCA. A new artistic leader will bring fresh ideas and direction, and—of course—the music will continue to shine and bring joy to the Adirondack region.

I am deeply grateful for the support you have given me over the past six years. I am incredibly proud of all we've accomplished together, and I look forward to returning—first as a guest conductor, and eventually as Music Director Emeritus.

2025 Season at a Glance

SYMPHONY SERIES

The 2025 Symphony Series at the Lake Placid Center for the Arts offered six distinctive programs, from the exciting season opener “Color My World” to the high-energy finale “All That Jazz,” which sold out one week in advance. The season featured an exceptional lineup of guest artists, including soprano Robin Johannsen, composer Jeremy Gill, cellist James Baik of Young Concert Artists, and saxophonist Daniel Gordon. Several programs also spotlighted the artistry of our own musicians, including Concertmaster Daniel Szasz, percussionist Tony Oliver, and Music Director Stuart Malina.

PARK SERIES

The Park Series at Mid’s Park remained one of Lake Placid’s most cherished summer traditions, offering six free concerts framed by the breathtaking beauty of Mirror Lake. When weather required two indoor performances, St. Agnes Church once again welcomed us so generously, providing a beautiful and welcoming space. Audiences enjoyed the Sinfonietta’s music in a warm, community-centered atmosphere that captures the spirit of an Adirondack summer. 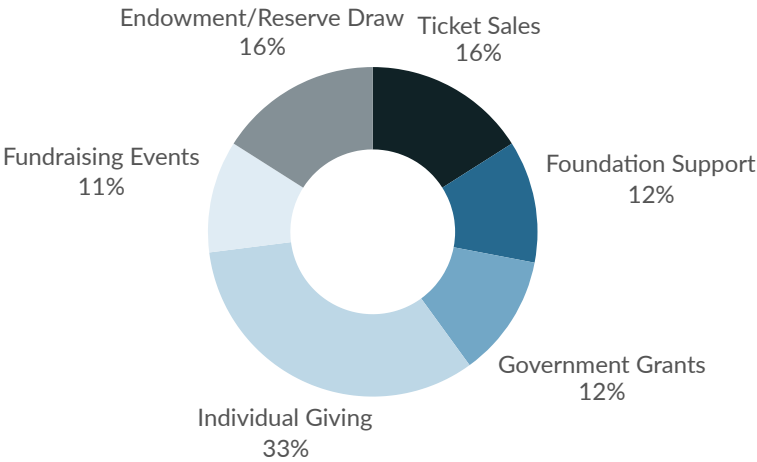

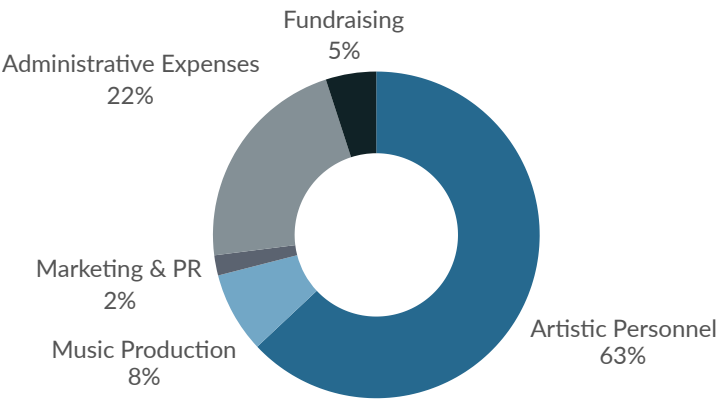
REVENUE
